"Once the temple was destroyed and the city was conquered, the king of Babylon wanted to have at his service Israel educated and talented sons for the palace labours, among them was Daniel. He knew how to interpret the dreams which afflicted him at night, where the end of his kingdom was prophetized. 
Group Role Play: Forgive and be forgiven

Two students must volunteert to take two heavy books, for example a dictionary. They will be asked to hold the book at the height of their shoulders with their arms completely extended all the time possible for them. When they start lowering their arms, they will be asked:

- Was it difficult to hold the weight up? How did you feel when the bool started to weight more and more?

- In what way is this similar to the way you feel when you have done something inappropriate to someone, but you haven't apologized for your actions?

- How did you feel when you could take the book down? In what way is this similar to the way you feel when you have been forgiven for something you did to someone?
